BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

(To be cross-referenced with the Personal Name Authority)

Thomas Hatfield was the first head librarian of Hoboken Public Library. A keen chess player, he married co-worker Nina, who retired until his death in 1925. He was known for his service to his community and to the library, and a Public Works of Art Project relief carving was made of him in the 1930s. The library still owns this today.

Nina Hatfield was the second head librarian of Hoboken Public Library, coming out of retirement and assuming the post after her husband's death. An artist and poet, she was a fine potter. She substantially increased the holdings of the library, started children's storytime in 1926, and is likely the person who began the history collection. Nina set the standards for the library's future growth and her work enabled it to grow into where it is today.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Hoboken Public Library first opened its doors on October 2nd, 1890 in the basement of the Second National Bank Building with only 3500 volumes, just a year and a few months after the first-ever Trustees meeting on June 14th, 1889. The library moved to its current location on land donated by Martha Bayard Stevens, with a building designed by the architectural firm of Albert Beyer, in April of 1897. Since then, the library has continued to provide services of all sorts to the Hoboken community, with children's storytime beginning in 1926, a history collection gathered over time, and social work and emergency kits supplied in the modern era.
